



SPRING CLEANUP EVENT

Waste Management will conduct a Spring Clean Up on Saturday, April 16, 2016. For more information on this event go to <http://lincolnshireil.gov/> All goods must be placed at the curb by 7:00 am the day of collection. Residents may begin placing materials at the curb 7:00 pm the night prior to the event.

Residents may put out household goods for the Spring Cleanup. Items such as carpet or lumber must be bundled in lengths of not more than 4 feet long and 2 feet wide. All items must be of a size such that one person can lift them.

The following items will NOT be taken:

- White goods – appliances, household chemical waste and landscape waste.

DISPOSING OF HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

SWALCO (Solid Waste Agency of Lake County) offers free HHW collections for residents. Mobile Collection Events are held at various locations throughout Lake County from April through November.

Year-round HHW drop-off is available at SWALCO's facility in Gurnee multiple times per month – by appointment only. Schedule your appointment at www.swalco.org or call (847) 336-9340.

DISPOSING OF LATEX PAINT

Today's latex (water-based) paint has a very low level of toxicity. Since disposing of it at large household hazardous waste collection sites is very expensive, the IEPA encourages the following methods to dispose of unwanted latex paint:

- Keep painting. Add a little more paint to the area that was worked on.
- Paint something else – it may not need the paint but will help use excess paint. Or use leftover paint to paint wood chairs, the inside of your garage, the playhouse or other areas around your home.
- Give left-over paint to someone. Donate it to a church, community organization, or to Habitat for Humanity.
- Use an absorbent like shredded paper, sawdust, kitty litter or corn husks. Depending on how full the can is, add the absorbent to the can and mix it up. When the liquids are absorbed, dry the mixture out and then dispose of it with regular waste. You may also be able to empty the can, dry it out and recycle the can.
- Store it for later. Cover the opening with plastic wrap and put the lid on making sure it fits securely. Turn the paint can upside down. This creates a tight seal and keeps the paint fresh for re-use.

Dear Lincolnshire Resident;

Lincolnshire provides a comprehensive solid waste program designed to encourage recycling and waste reduction, reduce litter in our neighborhoods and ensure that waste is disposed of in an environmentally responsible manner. We look forward to helping your community be as clean – and green – as possible.

COLLECTION SCHEDULE

Waste Management will collect trash, recycling and yard waste once a week between 7:00 a.m.

and 6:00 p.m. on your designated service day. Lincolnshire's collection day is Wednesday.

Waste must be placed at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on collection day regardless of when the waste hauler usually collects on your street. Substitute drivers do not always use the same routing.

Village Code prohibits placement of waste at the curb prior to 9:00 p.m. the day before collection and requires that containers be returned to their storage area by 9:00 p.m. the day of collection.

• Carts should be placed with handle toward house, along the curb.

• Residents have a choice between a 96, 64 or 35-gallon cart with unlimited or limited service. All extra bags and cans will require a sticker with limited service. See the Monthly Service Options available to Lincolnshire residents on the next panel.

• Stickers may be purchased at Village Hall or by calling Waste Management at (800) 796-9696.

RECYCLING

Lincolnshire encourages residents to reduce, reuse and recycle. One 64-gallon green recycling cart with a yellow lid is provided at no cost to each single family home from Waste Management. All recyclables can go in the recycling cart – no sorting required.

During the month of January each year, residents may request to exchange their current 64-gallon recycling cart for a 96-gallon recycling cart at no charge. Thereafter, residents requesting a different size cart will be charged a \$25 fee.

RECYCLING GUIDELINES

- Do not mix household refuse with recyclables in the recycling cart. Mixed refuse will not be collected.
- Do not put recyclable materials in plastic bags. Empty your recyclables loose into your recycling cart.
- All recyclable materials should be free of food. No need to remove caps/lids.
- Cardboard must be flattened or cut into 2'x2' squares. Cardboard should be placed inside of or stacked and tied next to the recycling cart.



MONTHLY SERVICE OPTIONS FOR WASTE*:

Residents selecting the limited service option must include a sticker on all extra bags or cans set out for collection.

- Limited household waste – one 35-gallon toter cart \$17.78
- Limited household waste – one 64-gallon toter cart \$18.90
- Limited household waste – one 96-gallon toter cart \$20.03
- Sticker for any household waste over the "limited" service level \$3.13 (Sold in quantities of 5 - \$15.65 - no refunds for unused stickers)
- Unlimited household waste - one 35-gallon toter cart \$18.43
- Unlimited household waste - one 35-gallon toter cart \$19.97
- Unlimited household waste – one 35-gallon toter cart \$21.10
- Senior Citizen discount from above rate 10%
- Backdoor collection service (addition to fee above) \$11.26

RECYCLING COLLECTION*:

- Unlimited recycling - one 64-gallon cart included with waste service
- Unlimited recycling – one 96-gallon cart included with waste service

LANDSCAPE WASTE COLLECTION*:

- Unlimited, Subscription Service, fee per season \$167.51
- Sticker Service – individual sticker applied to each bag or bundle \$3.13

Trash Service

Solid waste placed by customers for collection, except bulk items, must be contained in cans or bags of a capacity not greater than 34 gallons and 50lbs. All items should be placed by the curb by 7:00 a.m.

YARD WASTE

Yard waste is collected weekly beginning April 1 through November 30.

- Yard waste must be placed in biodegradable Kraft paper bags or cans clearly marked as landscape waste (max 33 gallons and 50 pounds) for collection. Yard waste placed in plastic bags will not be collected.
- Yard waste is serviced on Wednesday each week during the season.
- Residents may sign up for seasonal yard waste service or purchase stickers through Village Hall, Marathon Gas Station, BP Gas Station, Vernon Area Library, or Waste Management.

BRUSH AND TREE TRIMMINGS

- Brush and tree trimmings must be bundled and tied with biodegradable twine or string in distinct piles that are no longer than 4 feet in length, 2 feet in diameter and weighing no more than 50 pounds with no individual branch being greater than 3 inches in diameter. One yard waste sticker must be attached to each bundle if not on subscription program.



CHRISTMAS TREES

Christmas trees will be collected the month of January at no additional charge from all residential households. All decorations, stands, tinsel/garland, etc. must be removed from trees in order to be collected. Do not place trees in plastic bags. Trees in plastic bags will not be collected.



BULK ITEMS

Waste Management will collect bulk items at no additional charge. Place your bulk item at the curb on the same day as your regular trash collection.



- A bulk item is a piece of furniture or residential item that is too large for a container, or small amounts of construction materials and carpeting (cut into 4-foot bundles).
- Please limit the size of your bulk item to no more than 50 pounds and no longer than 7 feet.
- Construction debris, automobile parts, large items, large quantities of construction materials, concrete or landscape waste are not considered bulk items.
- Waste Management asks that residents call in advance to schedule collection of a white-good appliance. A white-good appliance is a refrigerator, stove, washer, or any large household appliance.

HAZARDOUS ITEMS

Waste Management will not collect solid or liquid hazardous waste. Examples include paint, pesticides, petroleum derivatives, such as motor oil and solvents, and explosive items.

RESIDENTIAL ELECTRONICS RECYCLING

Electronic items can no longer be disposed of in area landfills. Electronic recycling collection is provided through the Solid Waste Agency of Lake County at no charge.
