## Fall Leaf Collection

The Public Works Department will begin its annual Leaf Collection Program on Monday, October 4th. Leaves must be placed in the street by noon on Monday of your specified pickup week to guarantee one final collection by Friday. Leaves placed in the street after that final collection is made will not be picked up until your next scheduled week of collection. Leaf pickup is scheduled for Monday through Friday according to the following schedule:

### Residents West of Riverwoods Rd.

Week of October 4  
 Week of October 18  
 Week of November 1  
 Week of November 15  
 Week of November 29

### Residents East of Riverwoods Rd

Week of October 11  
 Week of October 25  
 Week of November 8  
 Week of November 22

Please be careful not to mix foreign materials such as brush, garden waste, tree limbs, vines, lumber, etc. with your leaves. Materials such as these can cause equipment failure or injury to the operator or nearby citizens.

Due to the large volume of leaves, Public Works crews can only pick up leaves on one side of the Village each week. It is important to follow the schedule and not place leaves in the street for more than two to three days before your scheduled week of pickup. You may rake your leaves and place

them on your grass near the curb as shown in the picture, then rake them into the street during your scheduled week. Leaves piled in the street during off-scheduled weeks become a fire hazard and can obstruct drivers' views of children at play. They also block the storm sewer inlets causing localized flooding. Please notify your landscaper of the Village's leaf pickup schedule if applicable. 

## Finance

### Budget Process for Fiscal Year 2011

We have begun working on the new Budget that will guide the Village from January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2011. The following dates have been tentatively scheduled for resident input into this process:

#### Monday, September 13th

Residents and representatives of Village organizations are encouraged to attend this Committee of the Whole Meeting if there are particular projects or priorities they would like the Board to consider for Fiscal Year 2011. If you cannot attend, you may send a written request to the Village Manager.

#### Month of November

The Mayor and Board of Trustees will establish special meetings during this month and will discuss a draft Budget. This draft, which will be available at the Village Hall and the Vernon Area Public Library for your review as of October 15th, will include personnel, programs and capital expenditures.

#### Monday, November 8th

The Budget will appear as an item for discussion on the Committee of the Whole Meeting Agenda. This will be your opportunity to comment on the document and on discussions by Board members at the previous weeks Budget meetings.

Final Budget consideration and approval is expected to occur on December 13th.

### Senior Citizen Tax Relief

If you are a senior citizen, sixty-five years or older, residing in a single-family residence, individual condominium or townhome upon which you are obligated to pay real estate property taxes, you may be eligible for senior citizen tax relief. The amount to be refunded to you from your Lake County property tax bill will be the dollars paid to the Village of Lincolnshire Pension Funds. To qualify, your total adjusted gross income (which is the total dollars you receive from any source - dividends, pension, Social Security, etc.) CANNOT exceed the number the IRS designates as the maximum allowable Social Security benefit a household can receive. For example, in 2009, the maximum allowable social security benefit was \$42,228. Therefore, to receive the senior citizen tax relief from your 2009 Lake County property tax bill, your total household income cannot be higher than \$42,228.

The application deadline is December 31, 2010.

### Automatic Pay for Water/Sewer Bills

Did you know that you can pay your water/sewer bills by an Automatic Utility Pay method through direct debit from your bank? Money to cover the amount of your water bill must be in your bank account on the bill's due date. You'll be able to tell if your payment will be credited to your account by looking at your bill. It will state "Auto-Pay". This means the amount of the bill will be automatically deducted from a personal account you have specified. Of course, our regular method of mailing water/sewer bills will continue for those not interested in "Automatic Utility Pay", but we encourage you to "sign up"! # Environment and Trees

## Gypsy Moth Update: Seek and Destroy All Accessible Egg Masses!

As many Lincolnshire residents know, gypsy moth populations throughout the Village (and the entire region) have been on the rise over the past couple of years. Areas that, in previous years, showed little or no gypsy moth presence, now have large enough populations to warrant serious control efforts. Fortunately, for the Village of Lincolnshire, our aerial spraying efforts (aimed at limiting tree damage resulting from gypsy moth caterpillars) proved to be very effective.



Continuation of aerial spraying is subject to budget restraints. Therefore, it cannot be overemphasized that **PHYSICAL REMOVAL AND/OR DESTRUCTION IS THE BEST METHOD FOR REDUCING AND CONTROLLING THE GYPSY MOTH POPULATION IN LINCOLNSHIRE.**

From now until May of next year, gypsy moths are in the egg stage of their life cycle. You can find the gypsy moth “egg masses” (each containing up to 1,000 individual eggs) affixed to tree trunks, wood piles, house walls and on just about any other outdoor surface. The egg masses, which are tan colored and fuzzy, measure about 3/4” x 1ft. Lincolnshire residents who observed gypsy moth caterpillars this summer should seek out all accessible egg masses and destroy them as follows (PLEASE NOTE: Egg mass destruction procedures have changed):

1. Prepare a bucket or other container.
2. Use a knife, pencil or stick to scrape all accessible egg masses into the container. (Please Note: The egg masses will detach and crumble very easily so be sure that all the tiny eggs make it into the container.)
3. Transfer the collected eggs to a grill, fire pit or other fire appropriate location and burn them. (If you have a charcoal grill, just throw them on the hot embers. However, if you use a gas grill, simply wrap them in tin foil and let them cook for a few minutes).
4. DO NOT ATTEMPT TO CRUSH THE EGG MASSES. They are very hard and numerous, and you will inevitably miss thousands of them.
5. DO NOT SOAK EGG MASSES IN WATER. While this was an accepted method of destroying gypsy moth eggs, recent studies have shown that many eggs may survive the soap bath.

Gypsy Moths will never be completely eradicated from Lincolnshire, but with a little bit of effort, you can ensure that the trees on your property are safe from this destructive pest.

**Due to budget constraints, there will be no Brush Collection in Lincolnshire this year.**

## Illinois River Day September 18th

The Village will be hosting a River Day at Rivershire Park (45 Londonderry Lane) on Saturday, September 18th, from 9:00 a.m. to noon. Volunteers are encouraged to come and work for as little or as long as they like. Work will center on collecting debris along the river channel, cutting and removing non-native species and getting to know fellow volunteers.

This is a great family activity and teaches children the value of service. Volunteers should wear clothing and shoes that can get dirty and, if you have them, bring gloves and hand pruners. The Village will provide water and a mid-morning snack.

## Public Works

### Sump Pump Discharge

The Village Code requires that residents disconnect sump pump discharges that flow to the street and redirect the flow onto their own property between November 1st and April 1st. This is done to prevent ice buildup in the streets which could create a hazard to both motorists and pedestrians alike, as well as cause excessive damage to our roadways and snow removal equipment.

### Clean Your Grates

In the fall and spring, and after heavy rains, be sure to check the storm sewer grates on the street by your house and in your yard. Grates clogged with leaves and trash can cause flooding. Please remove the debris away from the grate. If the debris is large, contact Wendy Moderhack at the Public Works Facility at 847.913.2380 to request assistance.

# 2010 Election

## Voting Options

All voters in Illinois now have three voting options. In addition to the traditional Election Day, any voter can opt to vote prior to Election Day, choosing either to Vote by Mail or Early Voting in person.

### Early Voting

The location where Lincolnshire residents can vote early is the Vernon Township Office, 3050 N. Main Street, Buffalo Grove, IL 847.634.4600. Early Voting runs from October 11 through October 28, 2010 at 20 sites across the County. An early voter must be registered to vote and cast their ballot in person at the local Early Voting site assigned to them. Voters can visit [VoteEarly.info](http://VoteEarly.info) to confirm they are registered, preview the official ballot and see a picture and driving directions to the local early voting site. An early voter must present a valid government-issued identification card containing their photograph.

**Voting By Mail** -A recent change in Illinois law permits any registered voter to vote by mail. Voters are not required to have a reason to vote by mail. The Lake County Clerk's office now offers a permanent Voting by Mail program. Requests can be made via email at [VotingByMail@lakecountyil.gov](mailto:VotingByMail@lakecountyil.gov) or by calling 847.377.2406. Online fillable enrollment forms are available at [VotingByMail.info](http://VotingByMail.info) which can be printed, signed and mailed to the County Clerk's office. Permanent enrollment helps the County Clerk's office gauge the number of voters choosing to vote by mail and, therefore, reduce increased printing costs under the new "choice of three" voting methods.

**Temporarily Absent Student Program** -As always, this program is available to students away at school.

**Snowbird Program** - Voters who travel seasonally can enroll in the Snowbird Program and specify elections and an alternate address to which a ballot should be mailed. Those enrolled will automatically receive a ballot by mail as specified.

As required by state law, voting by mail requests cannot be processed until 40 days prior to Election Day (or later, subject to final certification of candidates by the State Board of Elections). Ballots cannot be mailed after October 28, 2010.

Please note: Voters requesting a ballot prior to Election Day are not entitled to cast a ballot on Election Day.

Voters choosing to vote on Tuesday, November 2, 2010 can visit [WhereDoIVote.info](http://WhereDoIVote.info) to find the voting site assigned to them, get driving directions, print a map and see a picture of the site. ## Candidate Signage

Village Code regulates the size of political signs. The maximum size for political signs is six square feet, which is the size of a standard 2 x 3 foot sign, and the overall height cannot be any greater than four feet off the ground.

All political signs must be displayed no more than thirty-six days prior to and removed within two days after an election. Since the election is on Tuesday, November 2nd, this year, no political signs should go up before Tuesday, September 28th, and they should be taken down by Thursday, November 4th. Since the wastehaulers come through the Village on Wednesday, November 3rd, it's a good idea to take the signs out of your yard and put them at the curb at the same time you put out your waste and recyclables.

Signs must be placed on private property with the consent of the homeowner. Private property typically begins fifteen feet from the roadway. Rights-of-way along roads such as Riverwoods Road, Route 22 and Milwaukee Avenue are not private property. Any signage along these roadways must be placed on private property with the consent of the homeowners. Any signage not meeting this criteria will be removed by the Village staff.

## Consolidated Election - April 5, 2011 - Interested in Running for Office?

Petition packets will be available at the Village Hall, as well as the Lake County Clerk's Office, for candidates planning to run for Mayor, Trustee or Village Clerk in the Consolidated Election on Tuesday, April 5, 2011. Petitions can be circulated between September 24th and December 20th. Three four-year term Trustees' seats will be decided in this election along with four-year terms for the positions of Mayor and Village Clerk. Nomination papers for new political parties, independents and nonpartisan candidates must be filed at the Village Hall between December 13th and December 20th. ## Police

### Dogs in the Neighborhood

Sometimes it is easier to just open the door and let your dog out, rather than putting it on a leash and taking it for a walk. But, with dog ownership comes responsibilities. The Village has received complaints from some joggers that they are being confronted by dogs while they jog in the early morning and in the evening. Dogs must be on a leash except when they are on your own property. If the jogger presses charges, the dog owners will be ticketed which may require a court appearance. Please be respectful of your neighbors and the laws. Also, when walking your pet, make sure you bring an implement along and pick up your dog's deposits - no one wants to clean up after someone else's pet (and it's a violation of Village Code). Thanks for your cooperation.



### Child Safety Seats

With Labor Day and Thanksgiving travels, residents should be aware that the Village loans infant and toddler booster seats, without charge, on a first-come, first-serve basis. If you have relatives or friends with children coming into town for the upcoming holidays and need an infant, toddler or booster seat, call 847.883.9900 to reserve your seat. Please call early. The supply is limited!

We have two rear-facing infant seats that can be used for children 5 to 22 pounds; two convertible seats for children 5-30 pounds when rear facing and forward facing for children 20-40 pounds, (and at least 1 year of age if forward facing). We also have 3 booster seats for children 40-100 pounds. All of the seats are equipped to be used with the LATCH systems in all new vehicles



### Please ICE Your Cell Phones!

Well, not literally. In case of emergency, paramedics will turn to a victim's cell phone for clues to that person's identity. You can make their job much easier with simple idea that safety officials are trying to get everyone to adopt: ICE. ICE stands for "In Case of Emergency". If you add an entry in the contacts list in your cell phone under ICE, with the name and phone number of the person(s) that the emergency services should call on your behalf, you can save them a lot of time and have your loved ones contacted quickly. It will only takes a few minutes of your time to do it. Paramedics and fire and police officials know what ICE means and they look for it immediately. ICE your cell phone, NOW!

## Recreation

### Important Information

Lincolnshire, like many municipalities throughout the country, is struggling to balance its budget. Over the past 18 months, all line items have been reviewed. Many of the discretionary expenses, services or programs have already been reduced or eliminated, but additional changes are necessary as revenues continue to decline. People have many more options available to them to meet their recreational needs than they had in the past and do not rely on the Village to meet those needs. Despite attempts to increase participation in recreation programs, participation levels have continued to decrease. Therefore, the Village Board determined that it is in the best financial interest to discontinue recreation programming at the end of 2010. Fall programs will continue as scheduled this year. This decision does not affect the lifeguard program at Spring Lake Beach which will return in the summer of 2011.

# Emergency Preparedness

# Important Information

At one time or another many families in Lincolnshire will experience an emergency. These emergencies can be small or large, i.e. broken water pipe, toilet or faucet leak, furnace breakdown, flood, fire or a variety of other emergencies. It is even possible that the entire Village could experience an emergency.

The last few months the Village has been providing information to you to help you in the event of an emergency. If there is a Village-wide emergency, the Village will be focused on issues that affect the entire Village and will probably not have the manpower to help individual homeowners. That is why it is very important that you take the initiative to do what you can to prepare yourself and your family for an emergency – whether it is an individual emergency or one that is community wide.

Each family member should know the following. In addition, this information should be posted in locations where each family member can see it for quick reference in the event of an emergency.

Emergency phone numbers, i.e.

- 911
- Poison Control
- Gas Company
- Electric Company
- Family friend who lives close by
- Family or friend who does not live close by
- Mom and/or Dad's office/cell phone numbers
- Other numbers that are important to you and your family

Meeting location if you have to evacuate your home. (Practice an evacuation plan.)

Where to go in the event of a tornado.

Route above high water areas for flood evacuation.

Ropes or ladders for 2nd story evacuation.

Location to shut off:

- Furnace or air conditioning
- Natural gas shut off with location of wrench if necessary
- Water shut off

Finally, the Lincolnshire Riverwoods Fire Protection District has information cards that should be completed for each member of your family. These cards should be posted on your refrigerator. In the event of an emergency the Fire Department knows to look in this location and can quickly assess your health and history prior to treating in an emergency. If you do not have these cards, you can contact the Fire Protection District at

• **Waste Management North is the single waste hauler for most residents in Lincolnshire.** If you have questions or problems, the waste hauler can be reached at 800.796.9696 or 630.724.8400. However, if you are a member of a Homeowners' Association, your home is not necessarily covered by Waste Management North. Check with your Homeowners' Association for more information.

• **If you have any old major appliances you wish to discard, call Environmental Field Service at 800.480.4337.** This service will collect these appliances for a fee that is much lower than what Waste Management North would charge.

• **Problems with Comcast Broadband Cable?** Call its Customer Service Department at 866.594.1234. Comcast Internet - call 888.262.6300, and Comcast Telephone - call 800.266.2278. Unburied cable? If you don't get satisfaction, contact Carol Marshall at the Village of Lincolnshire - 847.913.2334.

• **North Park Hot Line** - On days with questionable weather, call the North Park Hot Line for field conditions at 847.913.2375.

• **Drop Mail Box at the Village Hall** - If you need to mail something to the Village, it might be easier (and less expensive) to drop it off at the Village Hall. There is a "Drop Box" in the circle at the front of the Village Hall, One Olde Half Day Road. Staff checks it daily.


