## Community Development

### Business Task Force

Following several kick-off meetings held in October 2009, a Business Task Force was formed by the Mayor and Board of Trustees. The main goal of this Task Force is to serve as a sounding board for business concerns and ideas to promote Lincolnshire businesses, and to recommend programs and projects affecting local businesses to the Village Board.

Task Force membership currently consists of eight representatives from various local business groups, including restaurant, hospitality, office/industrial ownership and management, retail center ownership and management, health and fitness, retail business, and service business.

Task Force Board members are: Jack Shniderman, Robert Vance Ltd., Chairperson; Kirsten Mormino, Mormino Landscape Services, Vice Chairperson; Ross Buter, Wildfire Restaurant; Hassan El Neklawy, Lincolnshire Marriott Resort; Cindy Herzog, ECD Company; Jon Janas, J2 Real Estate Group (Village Green management); Charles Lamphere, Van Vlissingen & Co.; and Steve Wild, The Lincolnshire Club.

Task Force activities are also supported by Village Board Trustee Liaison, David Saltiel and Greater Lincolnshire Chamber of Commerce Executive Director Judy Scalzitti (who are appointed as ex-officio members), as well as Village Staff Liaison, Planner Tonya Zozulya.

Since its first official meeting in December 2009, the Task Force has reached out to other business groups in the Village that are currently not represented on the Task Force. Additional candidates are expected to be presented to the Village Board for membership consideration, and a potential expansion to eleven representatives, over the next two months.

The Task Force is currently seeking membership applications from all interested parties but especially industrial businesses located in Lincolnshire. ### Garage Sales

A Garage Sale Permit must be obtained from the Department of Community Development no less than 48 hours prior to the start of any garage sale. There is a \$50.00 refundable deposit required for the Garage Sale Permit and the permit process will provide the Village the ability to better track the location and frequency of such sales. The permit will also outline all applicable regulations which must be followed in the conduct of such garage sales.

The number of allowable garage sales at each residence is no more than two (2) in any calendar year. In addition, off-site directional signs to direct buyers to the location of the garage sale are permitted. There are regulations limiting the number and specifying the placement of signs. This information can be obtained through the Department of Community Development.

Penalties will be assessed against anyone leaving off-site directional signs displayed past 6:00 p.m. Please be respectful of your neighbors and maintain the beautiful entrances to Lincolnshire's wonderful neighborhoods!



# Environment and Trees

## Native Plant Sale for Residents

In an effort to assist residents in caring for their native areas, the Village of Lincolnshire is offering native plants at cost. These natural areas are important to our community in providing a sense of place, habitat for our wildlife, birds and insects, and to protect the water quality of our watersheds and improve our air quality. (In addition to the native plant program you are invited to participate in the Adopt a Tree program.)



Occasionally we hear, “I don’t like the weedy look of the natural areas”. The key to appreciating these important areas is to understand their function and to identify the individual species within them. The more diversity, the healthier the ecosystem and the more beautiful it is.

The native plant order includes plants from sun to shade and wet to dry. The list can be found on our website, [www.village.lincolnshire.il.us](http://www.village.lincolnshire.il.us). It is on the home page, in the grey area entitled “Village Offers Native Plant Sale”. These varieties will provide something for everyone and every condition. If there is a plant you do not see on this order form, which you would like, please contact the Village and we will be happy to see if we can get it for you.

Plants will arrive around June 1st and must be picked up from the Village Hall on Friday, June 4th, between 7:00 a.m. to noon. or Saturday, June 5th, between 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m.

This is a great opportunity to make a connection with your natural areas and to make them a source of beauty and personal pride.

## Arbor Day Activities

In 1872, a pioneer by the name of J. Sterling Morton proposed a tree-planting holiday that he called “Arbor Day.” Morton, originally from Michigan, was a Nebraska Territory pioneer who realized the numerous benefits that trees could provide for people living on the treeless central plains of America. Morton’s idea spread rapidly, and in 1885, the state of Nebraska declared Arbor Day an official holiday. Many other states quickly followed suit, and today Arbor Day is a national holiday that is observed in most states on the last Friday of April.

In recognition of the importance of trees and nature, the Village will be holding an Arbor Day tree planting demonstration. This year the Village will celebrate Arbor Day on Friday, April 23rd at 10:00 a.m. at Memorial Park. (We will also recognize Earth Day at the same time.) We look forward to seeing you there.

## Spring Cleanup

### April 24th

On Saturday, April 24, residents

may put out household goods for pick up with the exception of “white goods” (appliances), household



chemical waste and landscape waste. Items such as carpeting or lumber must be bundled in lengths not more than 4 feet long and two feet in diameter. All items must be able to be lifted by one person.

All goods must be placed at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on the morning of the pickup. Residents may begin placing items at the curb after 7:00 p.m. the night before.

## Chicago Wilderness Day of Service and Chicago River Day

The Village will be a sponsored location for the Chicago Wilderness Day of Service and Chicago River Day to be held on Saturday, May 8th. Volunteers will meet at North Park at 1025 Riverwoods Road where we will work on path replacement and invasive weed control. Volunteers are welcome to come for as little or as long as they like. ## Gypsy Moth Spraying

The Village will be spraying for gypsy moth in late May. This spraying is done by helicopter because it is the most efficient way to attack the problem. Gypsy moths, native to Europe, have few natural predators in North America so the population grows rapidly. These moths can strip a tree of foliage in a matter of weeks so it is important to take action to protect our trees. Please note that two applications will be necessary. The second application will take place approximately two weeks after the first.



Letters will be mailed to residents who reside in the area where the moths will be sprayed approximately two weeks prior to the spray application. In addition, phone calls will be made to residents in the spray areas the day before spraying is to take place. ## Private Property Tree Adoption Program

Once again the Village will plant trees on qualifying private properties to be cared for, nurtured, and enjoyed by the property owners. Money for the purchase and installation of these trees comes from the Village's Tree Bank. Tree Bank funds are paid by developers or others who remove trees from properties for construction purposes and do not have room to replace them.

# Public Works

## Sanitary Sewer Service Lines

Spring cleaning is just around the corner. To reduce the chance of a sanitary sewer backup, you may wish to have your service line from your house to the main line cleaned and inspected. Tree roots can block the flow through these lines by entering through cracks in joints of the pipes. Commercial contractors who perform this service are listed in the phone book under "Sewer Cleaners and Repairers".

## Hydrant Flushing

The Village Water Department will be flushing fire hydrants throughout the Water Distribution System in April. Flushing will be done intermittently from 10:00 p.m. to 6:30 a.m. between April 4th and April 9th; April 11th and April 15th; and April 18th and April 22nd. The flushing of the fire hydrants serves several purposes: it cleans the pipe lines throughout the system, increases the amount of flow capacity and allows department personnel to inspect the operation of each hydrant.

Please refrain from washing laundry during these hours as clothing could become stained. Residents with water softeners should also check the cycle time of their softeners so that the unit does not regenerate during this time period.

## Information Available on Maintaining Wetlands and Stormwater Management Systems

Because we live in a watershed, we impact water runoff from rain. Our impact can negatively affect the quality of our streams and rivers.

Homeowners Associations and individual residents can contribute to the health of the Village's wetlands and stormwater management systems. In fact, most homeowners associations are responsible for maintaining the drainage ways within their subdivision. Residents can take steps to keep contaminated water on their property. This can be done by directing water runoff from our roofs, sump pumps and driveways into rain barrels, rain gardens, open vegetated swales or other features where that water can be used in a constructive way or absorbed by plants. Residents should consider installing plants on their property that are native to our area. These plants require less watering and absorb more water than many non-native plants.

The Village maintains a reference library with information assist you to make a positive impact on our environment. Two such publications: A "Citizen's Guide to Maintaining Stormwater Best Management Practices" and "Living With Wetlands: A Handbook for Homeowners in Northeastern Illinois" are available at the Village Hall.

The Village has enacted regulations prohibiting the introduction of pollutants or chemicals into the storm sewers as these pipes lead to open waterways.

## Fire Hydrant Clearance

The Village is requesting your assistance to comply with the Illinois Fire Hydrant Act (425ILCS 20/1). This law, which was enacted for better fire service protection, requires a 48 inch clearance around all fire hydrants. Please clear barriers, trees, bushes, or other obstacles which hide or impede the use of the hydrant. Thank you for your cooperation.



## Reminder

Commercial landscape contractors are prohibited from working in the Village of Lincolnshire on Sundays. Village residents and property owners who utilize the services of professional landscaping companies should inform their landscape providers that they are not permitted to work on Sundays in Lincolnshire.

## Find Out More about Recycling

Recycling, reduction and energy recovery efforts in Lake County are spearheaded by the Solid Waste Agency of Lake County (SWALCO), of which the Village is a member. This agency exists to manage and promote strategies to reduce the stream of waste headed to our landfills. SWALCO sponsors household chemical waste and electronics collections as well as educational programs aimed at improving our environment. ## 100-Year Flood Defined

“Does a 100-year flood occur once every 100-years?” is a question that we hear frequently when people discuss floodplains. By definition, a 100-year flood, also known as the “base flood,” is a flood that has a 1-percent chance of occurring in any given year (for other probabilities, see the table). The area susceptible to flooding during the base flood is called the Special Flood Hazard Area, or floodplain. The elevation of the water for a flood event of a given probability is determined by engineers studying rainfall intensities, stream and river cross-sections, and topography.

## Chances of Being Flooded for Structure in Floodplain

Period of Time	10-yr Flood	25-yr Flood	50-yr Flood	100-yr Flood
1 Year	10%	4%	2%	1%
10 Years	65%	34%	18%	10%
20 Years	88%	56%	33%	18%
30 Years	96%	71%	45%	26%
50 Years	99%	87%	64%	39%

Studies suggests that during the 30-year life of a typical mortgage, a structure located within the 100-year floodplain has a 26-percent chance of experiencing flooding but 4-percent chance of experiencing a fire. This statistic is the reason why flood insurance coverage is mandatory for structures whose mortgage is backed by the federal government. Remember, your general homeowners’ insurance policy DOES NOT cover losses from floods. Therefore, even if you do not live in the Special Flood Hazard Area, you should consider purchasing flood insurance.

## Snow Plow Damage

Village crews are careful to try to avoid damaging property as they plow the snow, but because the snow can sometimes obscure the line between the curb and the lawn, accidents do happen. If you discover damage to your lawn or mailbox after the snow plows have passed, call Wendy Moderhack, 847-913-2380, Monday through Friday, between 7:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. The Public Works Department will determine if the Village is responsible and will make repairs as soon as possible. However, landscaping restoration cannot be done until the Spring.

## Red Means Closed, Green Means Open

Soon it will be time to play on the fields at North Park. The flag under the United States flag, at the entrance to the park, indicates whether the fields are open for play. The red flag means that the fields are closed. The green flag means the fields are open for play. These flags are provided as a quick way of identifying whether the park is open for play simply by driving by the park. You can also call the North Park Hot Line at 847.913.2375 to get an update on field conditions each day.

# Public Safety

## Spring & Tornadoes

The snow may be on its last legs, but just around the corner is tornado season. While there is little you can do to minimize property damage, you can save your life by knowing what to do.

A **Severe Thunderstorm Watch** means that severe weather is a possibility. A **Severe Thunderstorm Warning** means that severe weather is in the immediate area. A **Tornado Watch** means that conditions are present which could produce a tornado. A **Tornado Warning** means that a tornado or a funnel cloud has been sighted and that you should be ready to take shelter. Tornadoes are accompanied by hail, thunderstorms and wind.

During potentially severe weather keep tuned to a radio station that gives frequent weather updates for your area. If a tornado threatens Lincolnshire, you will hear the emergency warning sirens. **Take shelter immediately.**

If a tornado has been sighted, take cover in the safest place possible. If you have a basement, go there and avoid windows and chimneys. Hide under a stairwell or heavy furniture. Cover your head. If you live in a split-level home, go to the lowest level.

If you don't have a basement, go to the central portion of the building, to an interior closet or hallway, away from windows. You should have a flashlight and battery-operated radio with you as well as your keys.

If lightning strikes try to get inside a home, building or vehicle, or go to a low place such as a ravine or ditch. Avoid using the telephone, if possible. Do not stand in small sheds or other small structures in open areas.

Avoid tall, isolated trees in open areas. Don't stand so that you project above the surrounding landscape. Stay away from open water, and avoid golf carts and clubs, motorcycles, bicycles, wire fences, metal pipes, rails or other metallic items which could carry lightning to you from some distance away.
