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## Road Construction Goes Round-n-Round

Construction is set to begin this summer on a roundabout at the intersection of Riverwoods Road and Everett Road in the northeast corner of the Village. A roundabout is a circular intersection where vehicles entering the intersection yield to vehicles already in the circle. Modern roundabouts are found in many areas of the country. However, the one in Lincolnshire will be the first one in Lake County.

One lane of traffic will be maintained on each approach, as it is today, throughout the construction period. The roundabout is expected to be opened by the end of 2010. ## Road Construction at Route 22 and Milwaukee Avenue

After last year's delays caused by utility conflicts and the winter weather, the contractor re-started their work on March 1st of this year, on the reconstruction of the intersection at Route 22 and US45/IL21 (Milwaukee Avenue) in Lincolnshire. The project involves the construction of a new concrete pavement that will add turn lanes at each leg of the intersection, drainage improvements, traffic signal upgrades, and path construction. The ultimate configuration will be as follows:

- Route 22 Eastbound: Dual left turn lanes, Dual eastbound lanes, single right turn lane
- Route 22 Westbound: Dual left turn lanes, Dual westbound lanes, single right turn lane
- Route 21 Northbound: Single extended left turn lane, Dual northbound lanes, single right turn lane
- Route 21 Southbound: Single extended left turn lane, Dual southbound lanes, single right turn lane

The Illinois Department of Transportation has a new completion date of September 24th. The contractor has established a very aggressive construction schedule and has every confidence that it will meet this deadline, weather permitting.

# POLICE

## "RAFFLES"

If you plan on conducting a "raffle," which is the selling of tickets of chance for a winning prize, you must first obtain a license from the Village of Lincolnshire. Lincolnshire is not trying to be bureaucratic or adding red-tape, but State Statute requires a municipality to license these events, or if the event is in an unincorporated area, the County handles the licensing.

The term Raffle means a form of lottery, as defined in the Illinois Compiled Statutes in which:

- (1) The player pays or agrees to pay something of value for a chance, represented and differentiated by a number or by a combination of numbers or by some other medium, one or more of which chances is to be designated the winning chance; and
- (2) The winning chance is to be determined through a drawing or by some other method based on an element of chance by an act or set of acts on the part of persons conducting or connected with the lottery, except that the winning chance shall not be determined by the outcome of a publicly exhibited sporting contest.

Per State law, licenses shall be issued only to bona fide religious, charitable, labor, fraternal, educational, civic, or veterans' organizations which operate without profit to their members, or to a non-profit fundraising organization that the Chief of Police determines is organized for the sole purpose of providing financial assistance to an identified individual or group of individuals suffering extreme financial hardship as the result of an illness, disability, accident or disaster.

So whether you're raffling off a car, a trip or a pizza, a license is required. The Mayor and Board of Trustees understand that in most cases these raffles are small in nature and do not generate a significant amount of funds, so they have waived the \$25 license requirement if the organization that is conducting the raffle meets the following conditions:

- (1) Has a membership of which 55% or more reside within the corporate limits of the Village of Lincolnshire; or
- (2) Has a charter or other official recognition by a parent, state or national organization that designates it a Lincolnshire chapter; or
- (3) Has a principal or sole place of business located within the corporate limits of the Village of Lincolnshire; or
- (4) Is an organization supporting exclusively a local unit of government which provides services to residents of the Village of Lincolnshire.

**An exception to this license requirement would be a closed meeting or gathering not open to the public where the raffle chances are not sold publicly and the winner(s) are determined at the time of the gathering.**

Raffle license applications are available from the Police Department and are on the home page of the Village website [www.village.lincolnshire.il.us](http://www.village.lincolnshire.il.us) under Applications, Permits and Policies. ## Your Pets

**Number of Pets** - The Lincolnshire Village Code specifies that residents may have up to three (3) dogs or three (3) cats, or a combination of three dogs or cats at a residence in the Village. Any more than three (3) dogs or cats is a violation and could result in a ticket being issued.

**Animal Litter** - The Police Department is receiving more complaints of animal owners allowing their pets to defecate on property other than their own and not picking up the waste. The problem is evident along the Village's bike paths. This is a violation of the Village Code and could result in a \$50.00 ticket. Be respectful and responsible and pick up after your pet wherever you are, and please help keep our Village attractive.

**Parks** - As a reminder, dogs are not allowed in any of the Village's parks at any time.

**Pets on a Leash** - While off your property, the Village Code requires your pet to be under your direct control at all times. While some pets are very well trained, most require being on a leash. Also, even when on your property, your dog may become startled or excited when a walker or jogger goes by, and they could dart at or charge the person. Please keep your pet under your control at all times when outdoors.

**Licenses** - Dogs and cats no longer have to be registered in the Village. Dogs are still required to be vaccinated for rabies annually and wear the rabies tag issued by the Lake County Health Department.

**Pet At-Large** - The Village gets numerous calls daily of dogs and cats at large and often the police end up bringing them to Orphans of the Storm because staff has no way to identify the owners of the animals. Most of the dogs are getting out of the electric fences and don't have a collar with tags identifying the animal. **Dog and cat owners should make sure their pets are wearing some type of identification tag in the event they are picked up by the Police Department. This will ensure your animal's speedy and safe return.**

## Public Works

### Building Construction in the Floodplain or Floodway

Structures located in the floodplain or floodway are subject to additional building regulations designed to protect not only the structure but also the floodplain. If you are contemplating a modification to your existing home, contact the Village before starting your design so that you understand the regulations before you get too far along in the process. Please remember that ANY modification to a structure in the floodplain may require a permit.

You may be able to construct an addition to a structure in the floodplain. In general, the cost of the addition must be less than fifty-percent of the value of the structure itself. This regulation is known as the Substantial Improvement rule. It is designed to limit the exposure of damage to structures in the floodplain. If the cost of a proposed addition would exceed the fifty-percent threshold, then the entire structure must be brought into compliance with the floodplain regulations.

Additions to structures in the floodplain may be located above the existing footprint or may expand the footprint of the structure. If the footprint is expanded, the additional area must comply with the floodplain requirements, which typically requires that the addition be elevated. You may not expand the footprint of structures in the floodway.

### electricity-outage @village.lincolnshire.il.us

The Village has received complaints regarding lights flickering, power outages and surges. These outages may be the result of weather conditions, accidents or equipment failure. The Village has been in contact with ComEd officials and is working with them to correct the source of the service interruptions. Several upgrades have been made.

The Village has set up a special email site to gather information on service interruptions. If your lights flicker or you have an outage, please contact Com Ed (especially if your lights flicker) and send an email to [electricity-outage@village.lincolnshire.il.us](mailto:electricity-outage@village.lincolnshire.il.us). You should include the following information in your email:

Name, address, type of incident: 1. outage, 2. surge or 3. flickering. Date of incident and duration of incident. Contact information (email or phone number) where we may reach you if we have questions about the incident.

We will use the information gathered to identify problem areas and will work with ComEd to improve service. Tell your neighbors!

# Public Works

## Water Meter Readings

The Village of Lincolnshire's water department will be reading inside water meters for single-family homes located south of Route 22 and west of Riverwoods Road to the Des Plaines River. Inspections will be performed from 8:00 am to 2:30 pm, Monday through Friday, beginning mid-June and continuing until the end of August. To eliminate the need to enter each house quarterly, the outside meter reading device is read to determine water usage. Inside meter readings are taken every third year to verify that the outside meter reading device matches the inside billing meter. This program assures you that the outside reading device is accurately registering the amount of water used in your home. This program also includes a mandated inspection of your plumbing system and sump pumps. The average time required per property is about ten minutes.

## Summer Water Restrictions

Outside water usage has been restricted in the Village between May 15th and September 15th. If your address ends in an even number (0, 2, 4, 6, 8), then you may use outside water on calendar days which are even. Similarly, if your address ends in an odd number (1, 3, 5, 7, 9), you may use outside water on calendar days that are odd.

Despite the vast pool of water to our east known as Lake Michigan, there is not an unlimited supply of water in this area. Under an international treaty, communities bordering Lake Michigan are restricted in the amount of water that can be withdrawn from the lake. As a result, the Illinois Department of Natural Resources, Division of Water Resources, requires communities to take measures to conserve water. Outside water use restrictions are implemented by communities as one such conservation. In Lincolnshire, residents may use potable water outside-of-buildings, including water used for sprinkling of lawns and gardens or washing cars, in accordance with this odd/even schedule.

## Clean Water - Be a Part of the Solution

Because we all live in a watershed, we all impact water runoff from rain. We need to be aware that our impact can negatively affect the quality of our streams and rivers. The Village has enacted regulations prohibiting the introduction of pollutants or chemicals into the storm sewers as these pipes lead to open waterways. Residents can help by directing water runoff from our roofs, sump pumps and driveways into rain barrels, rain gardens, open vegetated swales or other features where that water can be used in a constructive way or absorbed by plants. Residents should consider planting plants on their property that are native to our area. These plants require less watering and absorb more water than many non-native plants. Use pesticides and fertilizes sparingly. ## Spraying for Mosquitoes

Clark Environmental Mosquito monitors the mosquito population and sprays the entire Village when appropriate to control this nuisance. If you prefer that Clarke notify you several hours before spraying so you may close your windows, please call Clarke Notification Service at 800.942.2555. This hot line has also been activated to allow residents to report standing water or to be placed on its Night Spraying Prior Notification list.



## West Nile Virus

The Lake County Health Department has reactivated its West Nile Virus Hotline. The WNV hotline, 847.377.8300, provides information about West Nile Virus and allows residents to report dead bird sightings (crows and blue jays), which can indicate the virus is in the region, as well as neglected pools and other conditions conducive to mosquito breeding.

## Lake County - Voting By Mail

Exercising your right to vote could not be easier. Gone is the old requirement of needing a reason to vote by mail since Illinois now has "no excuse" voting by mail for everyone. For your convenience, the Lake County Clerk's office offers a Permanent Voting by Mail program. Enrollment is easy, environmental (no extra driving), and there's peace of mind with new ballot tracking online offered by County Clerk Willard Helander.

Enrollment forms are available online at [www.VotingByMail.info](http://www.VotingByMail.info) with forms for typing in your information and then print, sign and mail to Lake County Clerk, 18 N. County Street, Rm. 101, Waukegan, IL 60085 or call 847.377.2406 to request a form. You may select all elections for voting by mail, or just those when there is a high probability for snow and inclement weather.

As always, the Temporarily Absent Student program is recommended for students away at school. Voters who travel seasonally can enroll in the Snowbird program and specify the elections and alternate address to which a ballot should be mailed. Those enrolled in any programs to vote by mail will automatically receive their ballot by mail for the elections specified on the enrollment form. Voters can cancel program enrollment at any time. As required by state law, voting by mail requests cannot be processed until 40 days prior to Election Day or later, subject to final certification of candidates by the State Board of Elections.

Permanent Voting by Mail, Temporarily Absent Student and Snowbird program enrollment is convenient, but it also helps the County Clerk gauge the number of voters making a "reservation" to vote by mail. With three voting options (by mail, in-person early voting and Election Day) available to all voters, staffing and printing costs have increased to meet the mandates. Knowing a voter's preference for voting by mail will permit reduced printing for the other two options.

A new ballot tracking feature at [www.LakeCountyClerk.info](http://www.LakeCountyClerk.info) under the Voter Power tab provides security and peace of mind that your ballot was received. Voter logs on to Voter Power under ballot tracker to see when the ballot was mailed and the voted ballot was received by return mail.
