New Chief of Police Appointed

We are pleased to announce the appointment of Peter Kinsey as our new Chief of Police. Kinsey will begin his duties with the Village on June 6th.

Kinsey was selected from a strong pool of over 60 candidates who had submitted applications for the position. He has more than 32 years of law enforcement experience, with over 30 with the Village of Arlington Heights. He began his career in Arlington Heights as a Police Officer and progressively enhanced his skills and experiences through several promotions. Since 2007, he has served as the Police Captain for the Administrative Services Division.

Kinsey has Bachelor's and Master's Degrees from Western Illinois University. He has furthered his education at the Southern Police Institute in Louisville, Kentucky.

Mayor Brett Blomberg stated that, "the Village Board was impressed by Mr. Kinsey's experience and background and was unanimous in its selection of Pete to be only the third Chief of Police for Lincolnshire since 1971."

Village Manager Bob Irvin said, "Pete has a wealth of law enforcement experience, to further improve our already outstanding Police Department". He will lead the Department to effectively deliver the law enforcement services that our residents, businesses and visitors deserve".

Long-Term Employees Retire

Two long term employees of the Village recently announced their retirements. **Cherie Yost**, Executive Secretary, retired on May 20th. She began her career with the Village as the Village Manager's Secretary in May, 1981. The building that is now the Rivershire Nature Center at 45 Londonderry Lane served as the Village Hall at that time. Cherie made each move with the Village Hall as it moved to the Half Day School, the Spectrum Office Building and its current location. Cherie was a resident of Lincolnshire from 1972 to earlier this year.

John Kleffner, Police Commander, will retire on June 4th. John is another thirty plus year employee, beginning as a Police Officer with the Village in December 1980. A trailer, also located at 45 Londonderry Lane, was the Police Department "building" at that time. John was promoted to Sergeant in 1988 and Commander in 1997. He most recently served as the Interim Chief of Police.

The Village appreciates their many years of service to the community and wishes them all the best in the future.

2010 Employee of the Year Lydia Scott

Lydia was charged with the development of a new division - Environmental Services - in 2010. As originally developed, the Environmental Services Division would oversee the management of open space and stewardship of the environment. After the first of the year, the Village's forestry program was added to her list of responsibilities. Lydia jumped in and created a seamless transition during which residents noticed no decrease in service. Within the first week of taking over the Forestry Division, she reviewed and cataloged all files and identified tasks which required immediate attention. She tracked down residents to determine what, if any, work had been done and sought resolution to outstanding issues. Within weeks, Lydia had completed her first project, the tree pruning project. She educated herself about the program, identified the areas to be trimmed, notified the residents about what was about to happen, and developed an inspection program with the assistance of Chris Fisher, a certified arborist with the Village.

Lydia has sought out ways to improve the environment at little or no cost to the Village. She obtained a federal grant worth in excess of \$600,000 to improve the look of the Village along its highway corridors. She has obtained grants to build a rain garden at the Public Works Facility to resolve a long-standing parking lot drainage issue.

She is a strong advocate of providing education opportunities by setting up wildlife workshops, hosting native area work days which contain educational components, and preparing brochures and other literature to keep residents informed of important issues. Lydia does not confine her work time to the 8-4:30 p.m. work hours. Whether the task requires that she be in the Village at 5 a.m. or 9 p.m., weekday or weekend, she will be there.


This is why Lydia Scott was selected the 2010 Employee of the Year, and the Mayor, Board of Trustees, Village Manager and Village staff extend their congratulations to her!

Lydia joined the Village in 1993. She was the recipient of the inaugural Employee of the Year in 1997. She resides in Lincolnshire with her husband, Marshall.

Finance

In early May, Lake County mailed out its property tax bills and the first installment is due in early June. Assessed property values dropped significantly in 2010 due to recessionary pressures. Lake County as a whole saw a drop of approximate 4% in its assessed property values. Total property values in Lincolnshire experienced nearly a 7% decrease.

The dollar bill illustrated below is a representation of the total tax bill of a Lincolnshire resident. The total taxes the Village levied for 2011 decreased by 3.5% from the previous year or \$55,000. The Village continues to levy property taxes for its employee pension funds and **not** for general operations. The Village's portion of the total property tax remains fairly small (3.5%) as the dollar illustrates. The average resident with a home having a market value of \$540,000 pays approximately \$424.00 in property taxes to the Village.

Public Works

Clean Water - Be a Part of the Solution

Because we all live in a watershed, we all impact water run off from rain. We need to be aware that our impact can negatively affect the quality of our streams and rivers. The Village has enacted regulations prohibiting the introduction of pollutants or chemicals into the storm sewers as these pipes lead to open waterways. Residents can help by directing water runoff from our roofs, sump pumps and driveways into rain barrels, rain gardens, open vegetated swales or other features where that water can be used in a constructive way or absorbed by plants. Residents should consider planting plants on their property that are native to our area. These plants require less watering and absorb more water than many non-native plants. Use pesticides and fertilizers sparingly. Summer Water Restrictions

Outside water usage is restricted in the Village between May 15th and September 15th. If your address ends in an even number (0, 2, 4, 6, 8), then you may use outside water on calendar days which are even. Similarly, if your address ends in an odd number (1, 3, 5, 7, 9), you may use outside water on calendar days that are odd.

Despite the vast pool of water to our east known as Lake Michigan, there is not an unlimited supply of water in this area. Under an international treaty, communities bordering Lake Michigan are restricted in the amount of water that can be withdrawn from the lake. As a result, the Illinois Department of Natural Resources, Division of Water Resources, requires communities to take measures to conserve water. Outside water use restrictions are implemented by communities as one such conservation. In Lincolnshire, residents may use potable water outside-of-buildings, including water used for sprinkling of lawns and gardens or washing cars, in accordance with this odd/even schedule.


The Village has received complaints regarding lights flickering, power outages and surges. These outages may be the result of weather conditions, accidents or equipment failure. The Village continues to be in contact with ComEd officials to seek improvements in areas that have frequent service interruptions. Several upgrades have been made.

The Village has set up a special email site to gather information on service interruptions. If your lights flicker or you have an outage, please contact ComEd (especially if your lights flicker) and send an email to electricity-outage@village.lincolnshire.il.us. You should include the following information in your email:

Name, address, type of incident: 1. outage, 2. surge or 3. flickering. Date of incident and duration of incident. Contact information (email or phone number) where we may reach you if we have questions about the incident. We will use the information gathered to identify problem areas and will work with ComEd to improve service.

Spraying for Mosquitoes

Clarke Environmental Mosquito monitors the mosquito population and sprays the entire Village when appropriate to control this nuisance. If you prefer that Clarke notify you several hours before spraying so you may close your windows, please call Clarke Notification Service at 800.942.2555. This hot line has also been activated to allow residents to report standing water or to be placed on its Night Spraying Prior Notification list.



West Nile Virus

The Lake County Health Department has reactivated its West Nile Virus Hotline. The WNV hotline, 847.377.8300, provides information about West Nile Virus and allows residents to report dead bird sightings (crows and blue jays), which can indicate the virus is in the region, as well as neglected pools and other conditions conducive to mosquito breeding.

The Clark Mosquito Hotline, 800.942.2555, has also been activated to allow residents to report standing water.

Please report dead bird sightings to the Lake County Health Department's WNV Hotline. This dead bird information is utilized by Clarke in coordination with the Lake County Health Department surveillance program.

Public Works

Building Construction in the Floodplain or Floodway

Structures located in the floodplain or floodway are subject to additional building regulations designed to protect not only the structure but also the floodplain. If you are contemplating a modification to your existing home, contact the Village before starting your design so that you understand the regulations before you get too far along in the process. Please remember that ANY modification to a structure in the floodplain may require a permit.

You may be able to construct an addition to a structure in the floodplain. In general, the cost of the addition must be less than fifty-percent of the value of the structure itself. This regulation is known as the Substantial Improvement rule. It is designed to limit the exposure of damage to structures in the floodplain. If the cost of a proposed addition would exceed the fifty-percent threshold, then the entire structure must be brought into compliance with the floodplain regulations.

Additions to structures in the floodplain may be located above the existing footprint or may expand the footprint of the structure. If the footprint is expanded, the additional area must comply with the floodplain requirements, which typically requires that the addition be elevated. You may not expand the footprint of structures in the floodway.

Emerald Ash Borer Treatments

As you know, the Village has an infestation of Emerald Ash Borer. All ash trees, left untreated, will die within the next five to ten years. The Village has contracted with a company to provide Emerald Ash Borer treatments and will be treating selected trees. Residents may contract with the same company at the Village rates. Tree Credit

The Village has initiated a new program whereby residents who purchase and plant trees on their property can get credit for those trees. A record will be kept in the resident's property file of the trees that are planted. Should the resident need to remove a living tree from their property at a later date, they can get credit for the trees they have planted. This credit will reduce any bond which may be required for the removal of the tree.

Police

Scams

Lake County has seen an increase in scams in the area. Read this so you can avoid being scammed!

A RUSE ENTRY BURGLARY consists of two or more persons coming to a residence claiming to be from a utility company or local water/sewer department. These people tell the homeowner that there has been a problem in the area and they need to check their electric/water. One person will take the homeowner to a remote part of the home, usually the kitchen or basement, and will act like they are checking the electric/water by turning off/on the faucets or switches and will also be talking to the other person(s) by two-way radio or cell phone. While the homeowner is being distracted, the other person(s) are going through the home, usually bedrooms, where jewelry and cash are taken. When the burglary has been committed, the persons tell the homeowner they have to get tools or business cards from their vehicle and then leave.

DRIVEWAY SCAMS are usually done in one of two ways. The first is in the same manner as a ruse entry burglary except the homeowner is brought outside to a remote part of the driveway by one person while the other enters the home taking jewelry and cash. The second driveway scam usually is directed to an elderly homeowner who is told their driveway needs to be sealed. These people will charge the elderly homeowner several hundred or several thousand dollars to put down a sealant that is more fuel oil than sealant and will wash away after one or two rains.

TREE TRIMMING SCAMS consist of two or more persons coming to a residence claiming to be from the electric company or have been hired by the electric company, and these people tell the homeowner that they need to trim trees on their property. One person will take the homeowner to a remote part of the yard pointing out what needs to be trimmed and they will also be talking to the other person(s) by two-way radio or cell phone. While the homeowner is being distracted, the other person(s) are going through the home, again usually bedrooms, where jewelry and cash are taken. When the burglary has been committed, the persons tell the homeowner they will be back later to begin trimming and never return.

The most recent **MONETARY PHONE SCAMS** originated in Canada. This scam consists of a resident being called by a person claiming to be a relative who says he/she has been involved in a traffic accident or has been arrested in Canada. (These people obtain family tree information from various web-sites on the internet and are able to call family members by their correct names). The person calling says they need several thousand dollars to repair the rental car they were supposedly driving or for bond so they can be released from custody. The person usually gives the phone to another who claims to be a Canadian police officer and will direct the homeowner to obtain a money-gram and he will call back later for the money-gram transfer number. Another monetary scam is when a person calls a resident claiming they have won an international lottery and they need to wire transfer money so the winnings can be processed and then sent.

The Lincolnshire Police Department is requesting any resident that has anyone coming to their home with these types of claims: **DO NOT LET THEM INTO YOUR HOME & DO NOT GO OUTSIDE YOUR HOME.** Close the door and immediately call the Lincolnshire Police Department at either 911 or (847) 883-9900.

Any resident receiving these types of phone calls: **DO NOT GIVE OUT ANY ADDITIONAL PERSONAL INFORMATION**, hang-up and call your relative and then call the Lincolnshire Police Department on the Non-Emergency number (847) 883-9900.

With the arrival of summer comes the Good Humor truck traveling through the Village. With this in mind, parents should discuss certain safety tips with their children:

1. Children should never go to the ice cream truck without their parents' knowledge.
2. Children should wait until the ice cream truck comes to their house and should not chase the truck to other streets.
3. Children should never step into the street. Wait up on the curb until the truck comes to a complete stop before approaching it.
4. Be extremely careful if it is necessary to cross the street to get to the truck. Look left, right and left again.
5. Never get inside the ice cream truck. The vendor can make the transaction from the truck window.
6. Parents should accompany their children whenever possible, but at a minimum, they should keep an eye on the children at all times.

The ice cream vendor is required to hold a license from the Village which will contain his name, company name and his photograph. If the vendor does not have a license, please notify the Police Department. At this time "Good Humor" is the only ice cream company registered with the Village. Questions?
