### **Public Works and Retiree Honored for Exceptional Service by National Association**

(LINCOLNSHIRE, III.) The Village of Lincolnshire Public Works Department was honored with three awards from the American Public Works Association (APWA) Lake County Branch during its annual awards ceremony.

Terry Hawkins, utilities superintendent, was honored with the Samuel A. Greeley Award which is given to APWA members who provide dedicated and continued service to a local public agency. Hawkins is retiring from the Village after over 30 years of service to the residents of Lincolnshire. His last day is Friday, February 14.

"Our Public Works Department provides exceptional service to the residents of Lincolnshire," Elizabeth J. Brandt, mayor, said. "The department is losing a civil servant who worked tirelessly to provide Lincolnshire with quality water and sanitary sewer, and storm sewer systems. After many years of service, we wish Terry a relaxing retirement."

The Public Works Project of the Year Award for a transportation project less than \$5 million was earned by the Public Works Department for their Illinois Route 22 emergency access project. The project constructed a secondary entrance/exit to Village Hall and the Police Department, a beneficial asset during emergency responses. The award promotes excellence in the management and administration of projects.

Tim Baynon, forestry/parks foreman, received the Award of Merit. The award is given to operational supervisors who perform their responsibilities in an exceptionally efficient and courteous manner.

The Village of Lincolnshire, 1957, is a northern suburb of Chicago and is conveniently adjacent to the Tri-State Tollway. Lincolnshire is home to 7,300 residents, two nationally-recognized public school districts, and over 400 businesses – a number of which are global headquarters and Fortune 500 companies.
