### **Lincolnshire Increased Independence Day DUI Enforcement**

(LINCOLNSHIRE, III) The Lincolnshire Police Department increased impaired driving enforcement during the Independence Day weekend in conjunction with the Illinois Department of Transportation's (IDOT) "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over" program.

The Police Department conducted three additional patrols which totaled 18 hours and 28 total traffic stops. Those traffic stops resulted in:

- One arrest for no valid driver's license.
- One arrest for driving while license suspended.
- Two drug arrests.
- 16 speeding citations.
- One uninsured motor vehicle.
- Four other traffic citations.
- Seven written warnings.

The Village of Lincolnshire continues to encourage all drivers to do their part in protecting all users of our roadways, especially with the summer months ahead and the anticipated increase in pedestrian and bicycle traffic.

The "Click It or Ticket" and "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over" campaigns are funded by federal traffic safety funds administered by IDOT. The increased effort runs concurrently with a media campaign reminding motorists that impaired driving has "Life or Death" consequences.
