Lincolnshire Development Activity is On the Rise

- ⇒ **Regal Theater Redevelopment & 404 Social Luxury Apartments:** Regal Movie Theater and IMAX, 300 Parkway Drive, CityPark Center, is getting a new look as part of a major redevelopment. The majority of theater auditoriums have been retrofitted with new, reclining seats. In addition, guests can enjoy snacks and/or beverages before or after the show. The theater parking lot is being redesigned in advance of construction of the recently approved 302-unit luxury apartment complex known as 404 Social (construction is scheduled for 2017-2018). The movie theater is expected to maintain regular hours during construction.



- ⇒ **Downtown Commercial Development:** Lincolnshire Marketplace, LLC is in the process of obtaining approvals for a Culver's restaurant on a 5-acre parcel within the Lincolnshire Marketplace retail development anchored by the Fresh Market. The restaurant is proposed to be located along Milwaukee Avenue, north of the Marathon Gas Station.
- ⇒ **Camberley Club Townhomes:** Construction is in progress on the 86-unit gated townhome development by Pulte Homes known as Camberley Club. The development is located on 20 acres at the southeast corner of Milwaukee Avenue and Riverside Road. Riverside Road will be realigned with Tower Parkway for a fully signalized intersection. Additionally, the developer plans to install bike paths along Milwaukee Avenue and Riverside Road. The vacant land immediately north of the realigned intersection will be converted to a small park.
- ⇒ **Lincolnshire Trails Townhomes:** KZF/Stack Real Estate, LLC received preliminary Village approvals for 44 townhomes on the north side of Riverside Road; just north of the Camberley Club subdivision. The 20-acre property has been annexed into the Village and zoned for residential use. Groundbreaking is set for spring 2017.
- ⇒ **Manors of Whytegate Single-Family Homes:** 15 single-family homes on a 14.5-acre vacant property on the west side of Riverwoods Road received the Village's preliminary approvals in September of this year. Developer Arthur J. Greene is finalizing plans for final approvals, with construction slated for spring 2017.

Winter Tips and News!

The Lincolnshire Public Works Department has been busy preparing equipment, training drivers, and planning snow removal response efforts for the upcoming winter season.

When driving in snow and icy conditions, you share the road with Village snow plows. Crews normally hit the roads before the snow starts to fall, and do not stop until the Village streets are safe for normal traffic.

There are two important things to remember in the winter season:

1. Slow Down - Plan ahead and allow yourself enough time to get to where you are going.
2. Stay Back - **Don't Crowd the Plow!**

Snow Plow Facts and Figures

- * Miles plowed by the Village: 40 miles
- * Number of snow plow routes: 12 routes
- * Parking on roadways after an accumulation of 1" or more is prohibited.
- * Village Code prohibits privately contracted services from depositing snow into the streets.
- * **Route 22 and Milwaukee Ave.** are state roadways and are plowed by the Illinois Department of Transportation.
- * **Riverwoods Road** is maintained and plowed by Lake County Department of Transportation.

If you discover damage to your lawn or mailbox from a Village snow plow, please contact the Public Works Department at 847-913-2380.

Ice Skating & Sledding Information

Spring Lake Park - Open skating is allowed from dawn to dusk when safe. Signs will be posted on the beach end of the lake advising users when it is unsafe for skating.

North Park - Ice skating is allowed from sunrise to 10:15 p.m. daily.

Rivershire Park - Ice skating and sledding are prohibited.

Temporary Ice Rinks - Temporary ice rinks are permitted without a Building Permit, as long as there is no permanent foundation. Please be sure the ice rink is not located beyond the front of the home and is at least 10 feet from the side and rear property lines. If you need assistance determining a suitable location on your property or have questions, please contact the Community & Economic Development Department at 847-883-8600.

Emerald Ash Borer Update

The Village of Lincolnshire continues to make progress on the removal of Ash trees infested by the Emerald Ash Borer. In addition to removing infested Ash trees, the Village has taken an aggressive approach replanting trees to maintain the urban forest.

Since 2014, the Village of Lincolnshire has removed 940 trees from residential parkways, Village parks and other Village-owned and maintained properties. The Village has also planted 328 replacement trees in these areas, as well as assisted residents with replanting on private properties. There are 186 trees currently being treated to extend the life of high-quality Ash trees. The Public Works Department has identified 58 Ash trees remaining on public property to be removed in 2017. This will complete the Village's program for the removal of all dead or infested Ash trees. Reforestation efforts will continue in 2017 through various Village programs. Protect Water Lines from Freezing

With cold weather approaching, make plans to keep water lines safe from freezing during the winter months.

- ◆ Keep home temperatures no lower than 55F.
- ◆ In extreme cold, allow cold water to drip through faucets.
- ◆ Open cabinets and closets containing water lines to allow warm air to circulate around the plumbing.
- ◆ Consider installing pipe insulation.
- ◆ Periodically check pipe insulation.

Sump Pump Discharge

Between November 1st and April 1st of every year, Village Code requires residents disconnect sump pump discharges that flow to the street and redirect the flow onto their property. This is done to prevent ice buildup in the streets which could create a hazard to both motorists and pedestrians, as well as cause excessive damage to roadways and snow removal equipment.

Christmas Tree Pick-Up



Waste Management will pick up Christmas trees beginning the first Wednesday in January through the 3rd week of January.

Holiday Safety

The holiday season is here and as excited as you are for the arrival, thieves are just as excited. Theft is a crime of opportunity. The following are important safety tips for inside and outside the home to lessen thieves opportunities.

Residential Safety:

- ◆ When out of town, contact delivery services to have packages delivered elsewhere. Packages left on porches or doorsteps are easy targets.
- ◆ Set light timers inside and outside your house.
- ◆ Always lock your doors and windows, even if you're only gone for a short time.
- ◆ Dispose of packaging discreetly. Criminals will spot something you've discarded, such as a television box at the end of your driveway.
- ◆ Notify the Police Department when you're planning an extended absence. The Police Department provides vacation watch and emergency contact card services. Please visit www.lincolnshireil.gov for more details.
- ◆ Establish a network with your neighbors for protection and notification.

Staying Safe While Shopping:

- ◆ Always lock your car and close the windows. Lock all packages in the trunk of your car or place items in a non-visible area.
- ◆ Be careful with purses and wallets. Carry a purse under your arm, and keep your wallet in an inside pocket. Avoid carrying large amounts of cash.
- ◆ Park in well-lighted areas. Stay off your cell phone walking through the parking lot, and be aware of your surroundings.

Drive Safe in Winter

Winter is approaching quickly, so now is the time to prepare for the cold, snow, and ice.

Below are a few tips to help make your winter travel safer:

- * Include a winter survival kit in your vehicle such as an ice scraper, snow shovel, sand/salt, and a blanket.
- * Ensure tires have proper pressure and effective tread depth to handle wintry conditions.
- * Clear all snow and ice off your car, especially windows and headlights for visibility. In addition, make sure your exhaust pipe is clear of snow. A blocked exhaust pipe can cause carbon dioxide poisoning.
- * Keep windshield washer reservoir full, and make sure your car has wiper blades in good working condition.
- * Use caution when driving near snow banks as they can limit your view of traffic.
- * Avoid using cruise control in snowy or icy conditions.
- * Maintain at least two-thirds of a tank of gas.
- * Slow down and increase following distance as road conditions and visibility deteriorate. Be cautious on bridges, overpasses, and exit ramps as they are commonly the first areas to become icy.
- * Buckle up – seat belts save lives!
- * Avoid the temptation to be on your phone while driving.

New Medicare Card

The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) announced the issuance of new Medicare cards. Currently, the nine-digit number located on the Medicare cards is a social security number. Having your social security number on your Medicare card provides thieves the ability to steal your identity. Reports of scammers pretending to be a representative of Medicare and asking for victims' information are occurring in our area. CMS will not call you regarding your new Medicare card but will mail you the new card. If you receive a call asking about your Medicare information, hang up the phone.

In response to public concern, Congress passed a law in 2015 called the Medicare Access and CHIP Reauthorization Act (MACRA) to develop a method to remove social security numbers from all Medicare cards. The change from the old Medicare card to the new Medicare card will not happen overnight. Beneficiaries will not begin receiving their new cards until after April 2018. The new cards will contain a new 11 character number containing a series of numbers and letters. It is important to note, the new card will not change your Medicare benefits. 
