### Electrical Aggregation Suspension

The Village of Lincolnshire established an electric aggregation program in 2012 in which the average participating ratepayer has saved \$432 to date for a cumulative Village savings of \$890,600.

The current program expires in May 2017. The Village received competitive bids to extend the program; however, the Village could not obtain rates that would be guaranteed to be lower than the ComEd rate. The Village will monitor the market and may re-establish the program, should rates turn more favorable in the future.

Currently participating ratepayers will receive a confirmation letter from ComEd in April, notifying them of the return to ComEd supply. **Residents do not need to take any action; they will automatically be moved back to ComEd** at their meter read date in May, which will be reflected on ComEd bills received in June.

Residents are encouraged to take a look at options for electric rates. It is anticipated that with the suspension of the Village's program residents may receive more solicitations from electric companies. When considering any solicitations, residents are strongly advised to avoid any monthly fees (that may be added to a fixed supply rate), early termination fees, and variable rates, which may float with no upward cap. Never provide your ComEd account number to a solicitor unless you have contacted them directly to enroll and you have reviewed all terms and conditions. Also avoid any "deadlines" associated with signing up for a program. If solicitors contact you in-person and indicate that they are associated with the Village's program, please contact the Village so that we can determine if the entity has a proper solicitor's license. ## Village Board Sets Priorities for 2017

On Dec 12, 2016, the Lincolnshire Village Board approved the Village's annual budget for 2017. The following is an overview of the Lincolnshire budget for the coming year.

### Budget Highlights


- Budget maintains a flat property tax rate for the fifth consecutive year.
  - ◊ Village portion of property tax is only 2.8% of resident's total tax bill.
  - ◊ Many homeowners will see no change in amount of property taxes paid to the Village.
- 2017 Budget meets Village Board policy to maintain a General Operating Fund reserve equal to 100% of annual General Fund operating expenses.
  - ◊ Reserves in excess of 100% policy are transferred to Capital funds for future infrastructure improvement purchases of large equipment and vehicles.
- No new personnel in 2017
  - ◊ Since 2007 Village full-time staff has shrunk by over 23%
- \$23 Million total budget (all funds)
  - ◊ 8.2% (\$2.05 million) reduction from FY2016 Budget
  - ◊ Majority of operating areas will see a reduction in expenditures for FY2017
- \$1.8 Million Water and Sewer improvements
  - ◊ Watermain replacement project in Pembroke neighborhood is the most significant project in coming year.
- FY2017 Budget reflects \$880,400 in roadway improvements – Pembroke Drive, Astor Court, Carlisle Lane and Whytegate Court.

### 2017 Village of Lincolnshire Goals


The 2017 Budget reflects 40 goals and objectives approved by the Mayor and Village Board during the budget process. The General Fund operating reserves have been maintained consistently over the last several years. It is the Village Board's goal to maintain one full year's operating expenses in reserve. The Fiscal year 2017 Budget includes use of \$1,968,755 of existing reserve funds in 2017 for various capital projects.

### General Fund Expenditures & Transfers



Time for fun and sun at Spring Lake Beach is coming! The beach will officially open Saturday May 27<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 a.m. The season schedule is as follows:

- **Pre Season (weekends only): May 27th - June 11th**

- **Post Season (weekends only): August 19th - September 4th**

Season passes are available for purchase at the Village Hall and the Spring Lake Park Pavilion. Daily passes are available from the lifeguards on duty.

**Season Pass Fees:** Resident Individual = \$20; Resident Family (max 5) = \$50; Additional passes for Family = \$10; Non-Resident Individual = \$40; Non-Resident Family (max 5) = \$100; Additional passes for Non-Resident Family = \$20

**Daily Pass Fees:** Resident = \$3; Non-Resident = \$ 6;  
Non-Resident (if guest of a season pass holder) = \$3

Lifeguards are on duty 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. weather permitting. If there are no lifeguards on duty, swimmers swim at their own risk.




## Seasonal Help Wanted


**Seasonal Laborers** are needed to assist with park and street maintenance activities. This is a 40 hour work week starting when the student finishes school and could run through the end of August.

## AARP Smart Driving Course



Interested in learning how to lower your vehicle insurance? The Lincolnshire Police Department is proud to announce its involvement with AARP's Smart Driving Course. This course will be offered on Wednesday, April 26, 2017 and Thursday, April 27, 2017 from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. in the Community Room At the Village Hall.

The AARP Smart Driving Course is the nation's largest refresher classroom and online driver safety course. This course is tailored to drivers age 50 and older and is designed for those drivers to learn the current rules of the road, defensive driving techniques, and how to more safely operate a vehicle. Common age-related changes, as well as, suggestions on how to manage and accommodate these changes will be discussed. AARP's Smart Driving Course is a classroom only learning environment.

The cost of the course is \$15 for AARP members and \$20 for non-members. AARP membership is not required to take the course, and there are no tests to pass. ### **Attention: Your computer has a virus, click here to fix it**

Has this or a similar message ever popped up on your computer? Have you received a phone call claiming your computer has a virus and the caller offered to fix it? If you said yes to one of these questions, you might be one of the 3.3 million people in the United States affected by this scam. Scams like these have cost Americans more than \$1.5 billion. Scammers may pose as Microsoft tech support, Microsoft Certified Partners, or certified computer technicians. Typically, scammers will attempt to gain remote access to your computer and once access is gained, they will generally ask you to pay for fraudulent tech support, install malicious software to obtain personal information, access your financial information, and alter your computer setting to leave your computer vulnerable for further attacks.

### **There are several steps you can take to help prevent becoming a victim these scams:**

- Hang up the phone if you receive an unsolicited phone call.
- Close out of pop-up messages claiming you have a virus on your computer or restart your computer.
- Do not purchase any software from unsolicited websites, emails, or phone calls.
- Do not give control of your computer to a third party without verifying legitimate representation.
- Do not provide payment information to anyone who calls claiming to be with tech support.

## Capital Improvements Underway

Over the next 6 months, the Village will be starting several Capital Improvements. Below is a schedule highlighting some improvements for 2017:

## 2017 Road Resurfacing and Watermain Replacement Project

The Village of Lincolnshire will continue to show its commitment to maintaining its aging infrastructure by conducting road resurfacing in the northeast area of the Village in 2017. The following streets are scheduled for resurfacing as part of the 2017 Road Resurfacing Project: Pembroke Drive, Astor Court, Carlisle Lane, and Whytegate Court. These areas will see a complete resurfacing of pavement, along with limited curb removal/replacement and storm sewer repairs. Part of the project will also include replacing the watermain along Pembroke Drive. This is being done as corrosive soil conditions have contributed to a large number of watermain breaks over the last several years. New installation practices and protective pipe materials will be used to address the corrosive soil issue. This project is expected to begin in April and run through August. The Village plans to hold a public meeting with impacted residents prior to the start of construction to explain the watermain replacement process and how the work will be completed.

## 2017 Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation

As part of the Village of Lincolnshire's commitment to maintaining aging infrastructure and ensuring the efficient operation of the sanitary sewer system, several repairs to the Villages sanitary sewer system are scheduled to occur this year. Work will be concentrated in areas south of Half Day Road, west of Riverwoods Road, east of the Des Plaines River, and north of Londonderry Lane. Work will take place in resident's side and back yards. Notifications will be sent out to affected residents in advance of the work. This project is expected to begin in April/May and run through July.

## Keeping our Waterways Clean



The Village of Lincolnshire is required to participate in the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES), to help keep our lakes and rivers clean. This program targets homeowners and businesses to stop them from disposing pollutants improperly by either releasing them directly into the environment or into a storm sewer. Storm sewers, unlike sanitary sewers, go directly into the nearest river without being treated. When household chemicals, such as used motor oil and antifreeze, make their way into our waterways, it can kill fish and plants living in or near the water. For information on how to properly dispose of your used or unwanted chemicals, visit [www.swalco.org](http://www.swalco.org). As part of the NPDES, Lincolnshire constantly monitors all storm sewer discharge points for signs of any contamination. The Public Works Department has numerous policies and procedures in place to ensure materials and chemicals it uses to maintain the Villages infrastructure does not make its way into our waterways. This includes the Villages snow removal and anti-icing programs which reduce the amount of salt used on roadways that ends up in rivers and lakes. ### School Construction Review

**Stevenson High School** - District 125, Stevenson High School, has proposed a 50,000 square foot addition to the east building on their campus at 1 Stevenson Drive. The addition is needed due to projected enrollment increases. This addition is currently going through the Village's development review process, and construction is proposed to begin around Labor Day 2017. It is anticipated the addition will open for students in 2019. The project has been preliminarily reviewed by the Village Board. The Zoning Board will consider the proposed addition next and hold a public hearing on the project. After the Zoning Board's review, the Architectural Review Board



(ARB) will review landscaping, lighting, building materials and style, and screening of mechanical units. Stevenson is proposing to build three floors for classrooms and science labs. The addition is also proposed to have a rooftop garden and be recognized as a Net-ZERO certified building.

**Laura Sprague School** - Expansion of the 14,000 addition started in February. The project is expected to be completed in mid-August 2017.

**Half Day School** - Improvements started for a 24,500 square foot addition, relocation of the west parking lot to a further west location, a new bus drop off configuration, a new stormwater detention basin, and a synthetic turf playground. The work is expected to be complete by Mid-August 2017.

**Please note all of the above-mentioned school building improvements are being completed with existing resources and none require a referendum.**
