Lincolnshire: The Place for Business & Growth

Businesses continue to find space to locate, grow, and prosper in Lincolnshire. The following are just a few examples of the exciting business activity occurring over the past year.

Heathrow Scientific and Daigger Scientific, medical companies with roots to Heathrow Drive since the mid-1990's, recently returned to Lincolnshire as part of a major expansion. Heathrow Scientific operated out of their Lincolnshire location from 1996 until 2000 before relocating into a larger facility outside the Village. In fall 2017, they decided to return "home" to Lincolnshire by submitting an application for a new 186,000-square-foot office/warehouse medical facility on a 10-acre property at 325 Marriott Drive. The Village approved rezoning, code changes, as well as site and building design to assist their expansion. Currently, the project is under construction and will be completed in spring 2019. In addition to Heathrow Scientific and Daigger Scientific, the building is also slated to house a third company.

Nexus Pharmaceuticals, a developer and provider of generic drugs to hospitals and pharmacies, was founded in a small office space at Lincolnshire's Oak Tree Corners Center in 2003. The company later moved to Vernon Hills and opened a facility in Mundelein. 15 years later, Nexus brought its headquarters back to Lincolnshire in a 38,000-square-foot building at 400 Knightsbridge Parkway, with an eye towards future expansion.

The Village welcomes residents interested and passionate about serving the community on one of the Village's advisory boards.



New Laws for 2019



More than 250 new laws took effect at the start of 2019. The following are some key laws directly related to law enforcement and the community:

Active Shooter Drills - The Police Department must coordinate with school officials to conduct at least one law enforcement led active shooter drill within 90 days of the first day of school. Any faculty and students present in school on the day of the drill must participate.

Dangerous Gun Owner Warnings - Police Officers and family members may petition the court for temporary removal of firearms from a gun owner if the person is considered a danger. If the petition is granted, the court may issue search warrants to Police for the seizure of the

firearms and have the weapons removed for a minimum 14 days/maximum 6 months.

Officer-Involved Shootings - Law enforcement agencies must implement a written policy outlining the internal review process of an officer-involved shooting.

Rear-Facing Child Seats - Children aged 2 years and younger must be secured in a rear-facing child safety seat. This law does not apply to children 40 pounds or more or children who are at least 40 inches tall.

Safeguarding Pets - If a Police Officer finds a pet in distress from extreme heat, cold, or other life-threatening conditions, the Officer may take the animal into protective custody. Any costs associated with the caretaking of the pet will be passed along to the owner.

Synthetic Marijuana - All synthetic cannabinoids, unless approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, are illegal in Illinois.

Stalking - Unwanted behaviors on social media has been added to Illinois stalking laws. In addition, businesses, places of worship, and schools may seek orders of protection against stalkers.


Traffic Violations - Any person cited for a traffic offense, excluding business offenses, shall not be required to sign the citation or post bond to secure bail for his or her release.

Crosstown Watermain Construction

With the completion of Westminster Way watermain replacement, the Village's next priority is to build a dedicated watermain from the intersection at Queens Way and Canterbury to Riverwoods Road which will enhance the Village's ability to maintain a quality water supply to neighborhoods west of Riverwoods Road and north of Half Day Road. The first segment will be constructed between Canterbury and Queens Way, and Riverwoods Road via Regent Lane, Kings Cross Drive and Buckingham Lane. A public meeting will be held with the impacted residents prior to start of construction to explain the water main replacement process and how the work will be completed.



This project is expected to begin in June and run through August. Construction timing is designed to minimize impacts to traffic in and around Sprague School. As a result, the 4th of July Parade Route will be relocated to begin west of Riverwoods Road at the Lincolnshire Swim Club. See the map to the left for the revised parade route.

Public Works

Capital Improvements Planned For 2019

2019 will be a busy year for planned projects in Lincolnshire. The Village budget includes approximately \$2.5 million for water and sewer improvements; \$1 million for park and trail improvements, which are funded through donations from new developments, and approximately \$1.2 million in roadway and stormwater improvements. Some of the major projects scheduled for 2019 are highlighted below.

- **Emergency Water System Inter-Connection** - The Village is entering an inter-governmental agreement with the Village of Buffalo Grove for emergency water supply in the event the main supply with the City of Highland Park ever becomes temporarily compromised. The connection with Buffalo Grove will be constructed west of Stevenson High School. Construction is anticipated to begin in late spring/early summer.
- **Bike Path Resurfacing and Construction Work** - Numerous bike path improvements are planned this year. The north-south path along Riverwoods Road between Duffy Lane and the southern Village limit will be resurfaced this summer. New bike paths will be constructed on the west side of Riverwoods Road between Whytegate Park and Daniel Wright Jr. High and on the east side of Milwaukee Avenue from Riverside Road north to Half Day Road. A new sidewalk connection will also be constructed between the Homewood Suites and Tri-State business park walking path.
- **North Park Tennis Court Resurfacing** - The tennis courts at North Park will be resurfaced. Tennis courts will be closed during resurfacing. The current schedule is to begin April/May and complete by June/July of 2019.
- **2019 Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation** - As part of the Village of Lincolnshire's comprehensive sewer rehabilitation program, staff will be rehabilitating approximately 2,000 feet of sanitary main to extend the life of the utility and prevent future sewer replacements. Staff will primarily perform repairs throughout various areas based on defects identified in previous engineering evaluations. These areas will be primarily east of Riverwoods Road and south of Half Day Road. Impacted residents will be notified in advance of the project.
- **Village-wide Storm Sewer Capacity Study** - A village-wide study of the capacity of the storm sewer system will be started. This study will help identify flooding issues and help program improvements in the Village's 10-year capital program. Additional information will be sent out to residents regarding input for this study later this spring/summer.

Keeping our Waterways Clean

The lakes and rivers located in and around Lincolnshire are valued by residents as part of their quality of life. In order to help keep these lakes and rivers clean, and to make our bodies of water even cleaner, the Village of Lincolnshire is required by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency to participate in the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES). The NPDES is a program designed to monitor water quality in our area. Storm sewers, unlike sanitary sewers, go directly into the nearest river without being treated. When household chemicals, such as used motor oil and antifreeze, make their way into our waterways, it can kill fish, animals or plants living in or near the water. Therefore, it is extremely important that these chemicals are not disposed of into the Village's sewer system. The Village of Lincolnshire is currently looking to fill several Seasonal Employee opportunities for returning college students and High School aged individuals for the positions of Lifeguards and Laborers.

Lifeguards, ages 16 and older, are needed for Spring Lake Beach. American Red Cross certification is preferred but certification classes will be provided if needed. Applicants 15 years old are encouraged to apply if they possess a valid Illinois Department of Labor employment certificate obtainable through any School District.

Seasonal Laborers are needed for park and street maintenance. Work begins as soon as school is over and could run through the end of August.

Block Party Applications



Are you planning a block party this year? The Village of Lincolnshire requires residents hosting Block Parties to complete an application available on the

Village website at www.lincolnshireil.gov under Applications, Permits and Policies section. Submit the application to Staff at Village Hall along with a signature sheet granting approval signed by representatives from each property directly affected by the road closure. Block Party Permits are subject to approval by the Village of Lincolnshire Public Works Department and the Police Department.

Tree Removal Permits

All trees or group of trees measuring 6" or greater in diameter require Village authorization to be removed by applying for a Tree Removal Permit. Tree


