BS&A Online, is a one-stop resource to access Village online services. Use the wrench icon at the top of the Village's website (www.lincolnshireil.gov) labeled "Service Requests" to:



- ◆ Submit a request to notify the Village of concerns such as:
 - ◇ standing water
 - ◇ downed trees
 - ◇ property maintenance concerns
 - ◇ lighting or sign issues at Village parks
 - ◇ garbage or recycling issue
 - ◇ abandoned vehicle
 - ◇ unpassable streets
- ◆ Apply and pay for permits
- ◆ Schedule inspections
- ◆ Sign up for Automatic Payment of your Water/Sewer bill
- ◆ Pay utility bills, miscellaneous fees, and Village invoices (like false alarm fees)
- ◆ View active Village developments
- ◆ Sign up for emergency notifications
- ◆ Discover Lincolnshire via the Community Portal
- ◆ Request Vacation Watch and Overnight


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BS&A Online feeds directly into the Village's software system and allows staff to build better relationships with residents, enable better response to citizen needs, and increase efficiency.

Submit a Request for Action: After clicking the Service Requests (wrench icon) on the Village's home page, click "Submit Service Request" on the right side.

Building Permitting: Check the status of your permit and schedule/view inspections. Additionally, residents can apply and pay for certain types of permits: driveway, roof, mechanical, site work, tree removal, garage sale, and dumpster permits are all available for online application. After clicking the Service Requests (wrench icon) on the Village's home page, click "Online Permit Application" in the center of the screen.

Utility Billing: BS&A Online can be used to view your water / sewer bill and account history online. After clicking the Service Requests (wrench icon) on the Village's home page, use any of the Search options in the "Online Water/Sewer Bills Payment" area. In the Search Results window, click your account. You will then be prompted for an Account PIN. It's found on the top of your water bill (sample shown below in yellow). Enter the Account PIN box and click [Submit].



The option to Pay your Utility Bill will display first, there is also a link to "View Additional Account Information" which displays your Customer Information, Current Bill, History, and Usage History Chart.

Miscellaneous Receivables: Miscellaneous Receivables are invoices for a variety of Village services. The most common invoice is for false alarms. Businesses receive invoices for services like traffic control and North Park usage. If you receive an invoice from the Village, payment may be remitted online by selecting the "Miscellaneous Receivables Payments" link in the left menu pane (under the Online Payments area).

Know Where Your Tax Dollars Go Village Property Tax Levy


In early May, the Lake County Treasurer's Office mailed the prior year's property tax bills. On average, Lincolnshire resident's assessed property values increased a modest 2% in 2018. The \$1,589,115 total taxes extended to the Village for tax year 2018 increased by \$36,330 from the previous year as a result of the new 444 Social development.

The Village levies property taxes to cover expenses related to State required employee pension funds and Lincolnshire police protection services. The 2018 Lincolnshire property tax rate is \$.241 per \$100 equalized assessed valuation. This marks the 7th year in a row the Village tax rate has not increased. The local average rate per \$100 equalized assessed valuation for other nearby communities is \$.675. Thanks to strong commercial base and conservative fiscal policies, the Village is able to keep its property tax rate lower than neighboring communities.

The dollar represents how each dollar of property tax paid by a Lincolnshire resident is allocated for the 2018 tax year.

Lincolnshire's local school districts receive nearly 70% of every dollar a resident pays. In comparison, the Village receives only 2.9% of every dollar a resident pays. The average resident with a home having a market value of \$500,000 pays approximately \$387.00 in property taxes to the Village which is approximately \$1.09 per day for municipal services (excluding fire protection).

For less than the price of a daily cup of coffee, Lincolnshire provides police, public works, drinking water, parks/paths, and general administration services to every resident.



Community & Economic Development

Won't You Be My (Good) Neighbor?

Now that summer is here, outdoor projects and landscaping are likely at the top of your "To Do" list. Be a good neighbor and follow these tips to make sure you do your part to keep Lincolnshire beautiful.

Apply for Proper Permits: Storage structures, fences, patios, and sidewalks are common projects and require permits. Once in place, they must be kept in good repair and structurally sound.

Construction Hours: Construction work, material delivery, and related services must be performed 7a.m. – 7p.m. Monday through Friday, and 8a.m. – 6p.m. on Saturday (excluding days when Village administrative offices are closed for federally-recognized holidays). Work outside of these hours is prohibited (unless related to emergency utility repairs).



Lawn Care: Keep your lawn shorter than 6" (code section 4-1B-1).

Outside Storage: Be mindful of your neighbors when storing something outside (e.g., shovels and wheel barrels). Only items "incidental" to residential use (e.g., grills and patio furniture) can be stored outside (code section 4-1-3).

Exterior Structures: Keep your home in good order. A fresh coat of paint or new gutters can really improve the appearance of your home (not to mention help with property values) (code section 304.2).

Refuse Bins: Refuse bins (aka garbage cans) must be stored out of plain view from the street and your neighbors (code section 8-4-13). You can place refuse containers out for pick-up no earlier than 9:00 p.m. the night before service and must put them away no later than 9:00 p.m. the day of service.

Signage: For homes on interior Village streets, signs can be no taller than 4'; no larger than 2 square feet in area; have only one sign per lot; be made of corrugated plastic, wood, or metal; and can only be up for 180 days at a time with 14 days between display periods. The same regulations apply for homes with frontage on Half Day Road and Riverwoods Road, but signs can be larger because of the higher traffic speed (6' in height, 16 square feet in area) (code section 12-13-1).

Public Works

Sign Up: North Park Rainout Hotline

The Village and Lincolnshire Sports Association (LSA), encourage residents to sign up for notifications regarding the status of athletic field conditions at North Park. To sign up for e-mail updates/text messages, visit the Rainout Line website at www.rainoutline.com. Type "Lincolnshire" in the search menu, and you will be prompted to LSA updates. Click on the Lincolnshire Sports Association title and you will be directed to a page containing current information. From there, you can choose whether you want to be alerted by email, text message, or download the mobile application.



Tree Removal Permits

Trees or grouping of trees measuring 6" or greater in diameter may not be removed without village authorization. Authorization must come by way of a Tree Removal Permit. To obtain a tree removal permit, complete the Tree Removal Permit Application located at www.lincolnshireil.gov by navigating to the Applications, Permits, and Policies section. Village staff will review the application and make a decision as soon as possible. Battling the Unwanted Mosquitoes

Clarke Environmental Mosquito Control, monitors the adult mosquito population in the Village and sprays when appropriate. Residents are encouraged to sign up for notifications prior to mosquito abatement applications by signing up through the Clarke Notification Service at 800-942-2555. Residents can use the same hotline to report areas of standing water.



Reduce Your Use - Summer Water Restrictions

The Illinois Department of Natural Resources restrict the amount of water withdrawn from Lake Michigan. Outdoor water usage is restricted in the Village from May 15th until September 15th, residents are prohibited from using outside water between the hours of 1 PM and 7 PM. Daily water usage restrictions correspond with address numbers, even number addresses may only use outside water on calendar days which are even. Similarly, odd number addresses may only use outside water on odd calendar days. For more information please contact Utilities Superintendent, Terry Hawkins at 847-913-2383
