

**TITLE 11: PEACE AND SAFETY
CHAPTER 9: OFFENSES AGAINST PERSONS**

11-9-1: ASSAULT
A person commits an assault when, without lawful authority, he or she engages in conduct which places another in reasonable apprehension of receiving a battery.

11-9-2: BATTERY
A person commits battery if he or she intentionally or knowingly without legal justification and by any means:

- A. Causes bodily harm to an individual; or
- B. Makes physical contact of an insulting or provoking nature with an individual.

11-9-3: RECKLESS CONDUCT
A person commits reckless conduct when he or she, by any means lawful or unlawful, recklessly performs an act or acts that cause bodily harm to or endangers the safety of another person.

11-9-4: HAZING
A person commits hazing when he or she knowingly requires the performance of any act by a student or other person in a school, college, university, or other educational institution of this State, for the purpose of induction or admission into any group, organization, or society associated or connected with that institution if: 1) the act is not sanctioned or authorized by that educational institution; and, 2) the act results in bodily harm to any person. 11-9-5: PENALTY
Any person violating any provisions of this Chapter shall be subject to the fine set forth in the Comprehensive Fine/Penalty Schedule of the Code described in Title 1, Chapter 17.
